All those who attended the film show prior to the LABA Annual General Meeting on Sunday 8th March, were amazed at the seeming ease with which Jack BIONDOLILLO threw that first ever televised 300 game, during the 1967 \$100,000 Firestone Tournament. It was noted however that many of the audience were left wondering who eventually won the tourney, as the game shown was only the first match in the stepladder finals.

Your reporter duly looked into the record books and found the following: BIONDOLILLO went on to defeat Mike DURBIN 188-181, only to lose in the next round 228-172 at the hands of Don JOHNSON The championship match between JOHNSON and Jim STEFANICH resulted in a 227-227 draw and the 2 frame playoff saw Johnson produce a split while STEFANICH shot him down with three in the 1-3 pocket to walk off with the \$25,000 first prize. By the way, BIONDOLILLO's perfect game was only one of four rolled during the tournament !!!

The results of the annual event in America in which the bowling writers, sports editors and broadcasters chose their All America Teams were announced as follows: 1st Team. Billy HARDWICK. Dick WEBER, Jim GODMAN, Dick RITGER, and Don JOHNSON. 2nd Team. Jim STEFANICH, Dave SOUTAR. Don GLOVER Mike McGRATH and Bill ALLEN.

The 1970 PBA Tour is now well under way and following are some of the latest results: Kansas City, Mo: Jim STEFANICH who had not won a PBA Tourney for 18 months came good in the \$60,000 Ebonite open, when defeating top seeded Dick WEBER 248-233 in the championship game to win the 1st prize of \$8,000. Earlier STEFANICH had to apply the knock out to Jim GODMAN 223 -194 after GODMAN had seemed to be unbeatable with wins over Jimmy MACK 246-197 and George PAPPAS 276-194. Milwaukee, Wisc: George PAPPAS had to do it the hard way in winning the \$70,000 Miller High Life Open. Starting from 5th position in the championship stepladder he had to bowl his way passed Johnny GUENTHER 233-202, Jack BIONDOLILLO 213-156, Ed BOURDASE 245-221 and in the championship game Bobby COOPER 203-199, to win the \$10,000 first prize.

Toledo, Ohio: Nelson BURTON Jr walked away with the \$6,000 first prize in the high scoring \$50,000 Buckeye Open. In the opening match of the stepladder final Ed THOMAS won a close match against Jim STEFANICH 207-205 and went on to beat Bob STRAMPE 230-161 but was then overawed by Ray BLUTH who finished with Ten-in-a-row for a 280-211 victory, only to come up against Nelson BURTON Jnr who

ran out 243-215 winner.
