JAN ROZE and CHRIS PETTY won the Mens division with a score of 2022

Over the five games.beating BOR FISE and ROD HODERT IN CORP. men from SHAPE by five pins. The Ladies division was won by JANE VIROT and MARGE ILAS with 1862, with the PAULINE THOMPSON/ENA GRANT combo only ten pins behind, and PAULINE THOMPSON came second in the Mixed Division this time partnered by NED ELLIS losing to ENA GRANT, partnered by BERNIE CATERER.

This was the first time in the event that more than one score of over 2000 was put up in the Men's Division. The two bowlers from the Brunswick Jets, CHRIS PETTY and JAN ROSE rolled on Saturday evening. They started well and by the fourth game a number of spectators felt there might be a 2100 in the offing. Jan rolled 1042 and Chris' score of 980 was very good, especially considering he had spent the majority of the previous week in bed with shingles. In the Ladies Event JANE VIROT, a bowler who we have said before needs watching, with MARGE ILAS, whose husband is serving in London with the U.S. Navy went way out in front when they beat the then leaders, WYN COLLISON and KIM WHEELER by nearly 90 pins. ENA GRANT and BERNIE CATERER did not start too well in the Mixed, their first game was 352 but they followed that with a 401, 371. 433 (Bernie 243, Ena 190) and 371.

In the Junior Division, there with only 13 entries. Here is an event where possibly the sanctioning hurt the entry. Wembley are trying to remedy this with a junior event at the end of November. There was some excellent bowling, R. MARSHALL and P. TAYLOR (Sheffield) won with a 1746 while S. LEAVER of Bristol was the best individual bowler with a

927 (185 average).

PAULINE THOMPS ON and BOB ELSE were the top individual bowlers. Pauline averaged 192 (947 and 975) while Bob achieved a 208 (1059 and 1021). Without taking any credit from Pauline, Else performance is all the more outstanding when the story is told that after bowling 1059 in the Mixed he lost his ball bag, and shoes, overnight, KEITH HALE, the resident ball driller and proprietor of the pro-shop, drilled him a new one. Then with a ball that he had never used before and in borrowed shoes, he went down on the lanes and bowled 1021.

This was the first time in the history of the event that the tournament had been sanctioned, not only by thw BTBA but also by the FIQ. It was the biggest entry in the history of the event, the first prize in the men's event was £145 and the first time that such a large contingent of bowlers from European countries, Belgium and Ireland. A large amount of credit for the sanctioning of the event must go to the London Area who assisted for years in the organisation of the November Doubles even though it was not a sanctioned tournament. Credit for the visitors from abroad must go to some extent to the BTBA for having the event included on the International calender.

Everyone contributed to make this yet another successful Wember Tpurnament.

DOUBLE

After cancelling the Double Elimination and substituting a Multiple participation format ABC Nth Harrow saw some of the finest bowling that has been rolled in this country. The early rounds were proof that the Bowlers had not 'Only come for the Beer '. In the second squad on Saturday afternoon, BOBBY MANSFIELD set the tone of the scoring with a 288 game in a 711 series. The 700 barrier was to be broken no less than 4 times, the other three being rolled by CHRIS BUCK, TOMMY MAR-SHALL and JOHN MITCHELL. The climax to the Fourney came on the Sunday afternoon when CHRIS BUCK and his partner BERNIE CATERER rolled a 1356 total, a score that although threatened was to remain at the top of the scratch division.

Our deepest sympathy is with his young wife 'Mims' to whom he had been married 8 years, and the two children, a daughter, Carla, who will be 7 in January, and a son, Reece, aged 4.

Derek will always be remembered by Bowlers throughout the country and by many overseas, as long as Tenpin is played, as one who dedicated all of his spare time to assist in making it possible for other people to enjoy their sport. Made apparent by the many floral tributes from all over the country from Bowling Centres, top and ordinary teams, and just individual. Bowlers, sent to Kingston Crematorium where so many of his friends gath-

ered together with his bereaved relatives to say 'Good-Bye Derek'.

B.T.B.A. A.G.M.

The National A.G.M. held at the Cora Hotel, London, on Sunday 29th November, turned out to be -a happy, cosy, thanks-all-round, social affair, informative and quite well attended from all parts of the country.

The Chairman spoke of the great step forward that had been made with the Govenment recognition of our sport, and paid tribute to both Morris Glazer and Teddy Tinling in the parts they had played to that end. The Great Britain Ladies Teams had done a wonderful job as ambassadors for our country. He praised the Executive Committee that the National Counsil had set up to run the every day affairs of the Association expediently and economically, through them the now close alliance between the Proprietors and the Players Association had been formulated.

He announced that the next AGM would be in July 71, prior to the World Championships, and that a

full National Council Meeting would be called in February.

A short report followed from the Treasurer, who received the Meeting's approval of his Balance Shee Teddy Tinling then filled in the gaps left by the Chairman on International Tournaments. He called for Members support for Dave Pond and Jess Morley, and hoped that Members would do their best to assist them in making themselves worthy of selection to go back and defend their World Titles in Millwalki. He thanked the proprietors for their help and assistance, especially for practice facilities made available for International Bowlers.

The General Secretary reported on last years 7000 Membership, and stated that considering the closures that had taken place in the last year, good progress had been made with bringing the Association back on its feet. He reported the pleasing state of the increase in Sanctioned Tournaments, and the almost 100% Certification Programme of the Association. Members to concentrate on bringing new people into the Sport of TenPin.

A new issue Rule Book is now being circulated. He received support from the Meeting to review the Awards Programme in the light of present day finance. He gave glowing report on the hopes of a great 10th Anniversary National Championships at Worthing and the provisional arrangements promised by Ambassador Bowling for its success.

He again reported Later on F.I.Q. matters, in an address to the Meeting, reminded everyone that 'The eyes of Europe were at this time on British Bowlers, Europeans were becoming more and more envious of our Champions, and aur accumalation of Gold Medals, -- he appealed -- 'make sure we are worthy of their envy! Announcing arrangements for the World Championships, he stated that he hoped he would receive good support for the package trip of two weeks from 15th to 30th August at an all in price of £155, that he had arranged for anyone wanting to go,--- the trip cannot be advertised outside of our own Members, and any Member who has held a Membership Card for six months may take advantage of a Stateside trip at this realistic figure.

The Meeting approved a proposition that scores of Juniors belonging to the Y.B.C. would receive recognition by the Association, and hoped that it would encourage Juniors to become BTBA Members and take advantage of the Award Scheme and Services that the reasonable Membership Fee would give them.

George Lord of Humber Bowling was invited by the Chairman to address the Meeting, and he took the opportunity to endorse the Executives Officers reports and hopes for the future, and in plain down to earth terms called for a united forward invasion into the future of the Bowling Industry. With further votes of thanks the 1970 Annual General Meeting closed with 2⅓ hours of its start.

SOUTAR now lies second in the many winners list with tournament winnings of \$46.419 behind MIKE McGRATH \$51.149.

With re-surfacing now completed at Lewisham, the first Tournament will be the LABA Blue Ribband Classified Qualifying Round on 6th December, which sees a line up of 24 competitors bowling in two squads. which should produce some interesting bowling. Events for note, are the Christmas Holiday Doubles on Dec. 26/27. And the Junior Open Classified which runs from 21-23 Dec.



Two names that appeared among the top prize winners in the NOVEMBER DOUBLES, were not too well known to bowlers who do not regularly bowl at Wembley, were JANE VIROT and MARGE ILAS. Both bowl in the LONDON LADIES SCRATCH on a Wednesday Evening and again on Thursday Morning in the INTERNATIONALS. JANE, who was a regular bowler at the 'Green', before it closed, holds a 169 average in the evening League, and has recently been appearing with the 'HIPPIES' over at Hounslow on a Monday . MARGE, in her second year over here, her husband is in the US Navy, is a keen allround sportswoman, who

enjoys bowling with her husband in the Navy Mixed League on a Sunday, as much as bowling in the Scratch League. Marge holds a 175 average in the London Ladies, and also holds the league high game. When some of the top boys in the shape of the BEL AIRES moved into the STADIUM LEAGUE, there was a little worry among the lesser average teams as to how it would effect the lower part of the table. One suggestion was to run a monthly most Improved Bowler' prize. It has certainly brought to light some interesting improvements The first month it was by RAY BRADY of the White. Knights, who improved 19 pins in the first four weeks. He has maintained that average

for the second month, and it was a team mate of his, JOE PICKETT who took the second month's prize, with 9 pins. JOE had been in a slump ever since the league started, steadily dropping, then at the start of October, he began to pull back. The only fault that car been seen with this system so far is that a bowler like KEN TAYLOR of the Apollo, who improved over two months, 26 pins, and PETER STOYE who went from 161 to 173, at the tough end of the 'scale perhaps need recognition. At the half-way mark FRANK JACKSON from Portsmouth was in the lead with a 1705 pinfall. followed by Belle Vue's Den McCarthy. The going was getting tougher but still the high scores were prominent and at the end a mere 13 pins separated the winner from ROGER COX of Weston Super Mare who finished in the runner-up spot and has been invited to accompany Chris on his trip to Copenhagen. The prizes were presented on behalf of the sponsors the Bottlers of Coca Cola, by Monsieur Hans Kuhne Minister counsellor from the Royal Dutch Embassy, who remarked that this was the first sporting event that he had attended where the spectators actually played the game they were watching.
